Encourage younger members to become more active.) and invited suggestions for a third from the floor. Two rough suggestions were made (Monitor pub change of use applications and object/campaign against them. Become involved in any bus service consultations/campaign for better public transport.). It was agreed that Lindsay Grant would ask for further campaigning target suggestions in the next A&W CAMRA Calling (by email to Andrew Middleditch, campaigns@awcamra.org.uk) by 13 May, when the committee would decide at their meeting."

50th Anniversary Pub Trail Challenge

The challenge is to visit 50 real ale pubs during 2024. This will take the form of a 3-tier award, i.e. bronze, silver, gold and platinum.

- Bronze Visit any 50 real ale pubs.
- Silver Visit 50 Good Beer Guide (GBG) 2024 pubs from any of the Scottish GBG Counties*.
- Gold Visit 50 GBG 2024 pubs from 10 of the Scottish GBG Counties*
- Platinum Visit 5 pubs from each of 10 Scottish GBG Counties in the 2024 GBG.

*A GBG county is a section of the GBG. So, for example, Ayrshire & Arran is a GBG county. To participate in the challenge, you must download the appropriate form from the branch website at https://awcamra.org.uk/50th-anniversary/ You are also encouraged to score your beers on the National Beer Scoring System (NBSS).
